

CALL FOR NOMINATIONS FOR PUBLIC MEMBER ON THE INTERNATIONAL ACCOUNTING EDUCATION STANDARDS BOARD (IAESB)

In 2007, the International Accounting Education Standards Board (IAESB) will continue its work on the standards project to promote consistency and quality in education and development for professional accountants and prospective professional accountants. The IAESB's work program will focus on developing further guidance for member bodies to implement the International Education Standards. It will also engage in promotional activities that will include meetings, delivering presentations and participation in regional forums and workshops. The application of the IAESB's due process will be under the oversight of the Public Interest Oversight Board (PIOB). The Nominating Committee's aim is to maintain parity between the number of practitioners and non-practitioners serving on the IAESB.

Vacancies on the IAESB

The IAESB will have one vacancy in January 2007 for an additional public member, bringing the number of public members on the board to a total of three. Public members may be representatives from member bodies, but cannot be practitioners. However, practitioners who have been retired for a period of more than one year will qualify for consideration. Candidates for appointment as public members may be put forward by any individual or organization for consideration.

Qualifications of Public Member Nominees to the IAESB

The Nominating Committee will be interested in receiving nominations of professional accountants in business, as well as individuals from backgrounds in academia, members of the investment community, government and non-government organizations. Although each candidate will ultimately be selected based on their professional qualifications, the IAESB is particularly interested in receiving nominations from women and individuals from Latin America, Middle East, Asia, Australasia, and Africa. The IAESB is also interested in nominees with skills in information technology. English proficiency (both written and oral) will be essential.

Time Commitment for all IAESB Members

IAESB members shall attend the three meetings of the IAESB per year. The time commitment will be nine days of meetings, with an additional five to seven days of preparation and travel time. Conservatively, this will amount to 125 hours per year.

A commitment to work on a project team is likely to be required. Project teams generally conduct their work by e-mail and conference call, and may meet at the same time as the IAESB meets. The time commitment involved in project work is estimated to be an additional 25 hours per year.

Some IAESB members may be asked to attend International Accounting Education Standards Board Consultative Advisory Group (CAG) meetings to present findings or seek input on projects. Estimated time will be 20 hours per year.

Members may have an additional time commitment in consultation with the nominating member body to discuss agenda matters and seek input.

Financial Responsibilities of Public Members of the IAESB

Costs for attendance by public members at all meetings are borne by IFAC. If a public member wishes to bring a technical advisor (TA) to any meeting, these costs are borne by their organization.

NOMINATIONS INSTRUCTIONS

The instructions for submitting nominations to vacancies on IFAC's boards and committees are detailed below. Nominations are submitted electronically via an online interface provided at IFAC's website.

1. Visit <http://nominations.ifac.org/>
2. Under the "Type of Nominations", select **Public Member**. Then click **continue**.
3. As the CIS page will load. Under the drop-down menu "Nomination for," select **International Accounting Education Standards Board (IAESB)**.
4. Proceed to answer the rest of the questions. The first CIS page requests information on your nominating organization (if you are self-nominated, please fill in the information by making yourself the nominating organization contact).
5. After you complete the first CIS page, click **continue** at the page bottom and proceed to answer the questions in the second CIS page, which requests information on the individual being nominated (if this is yourself, please fill in accordingly).
6. At the conclusion of the second page, please hit the **submit** button and your information will be processed.
